World renowned tenor coming to library

Ronan Tynan, a worldwide phenomenon and former member of The Irish Tenors, has performed in countless venues from The White House to Yankee Stadium. On Tuesday this "Renaissance Man" will bring his music to the Orem Public Library. At noon, patrons are invited to gather at the library's fireplace to watch as Tynan and renowned coach-accompanist Bill Lewis offer tips to aspiring singers. Known for his wit and wisdom, Tynan is one of the most sought after motivational speakers in the U.S., presenting nearly 50 speeches annually for major international corporations and organizations.

From Billboard chart-topper, to gold medal paralympian, to physician, Tynan is a man of many talents. Tynan won both the John McCormack Cup for Tenor Voice and the BBC talent show "Go For It" less than one year after beginning the study of voice. The following year, he won the International Operatic Singing Competition in Maumarde, France. He made his operatic debut as Pinkerton in Puccini's "Madame Butterfly," and cut his teeth on the concert repertoire in performances of Verdi's "Requiem," Mendelssohn's "Elijah," Handel's "Messiah," Rossini's "Stabat Mater" and

Puccini's "Messa di Gloria." In 1998, Tynan joined Anthony Kearns and John McDermott (later Finbar Wright) as The Irish Tenors, an instant worldwide sensation.
