

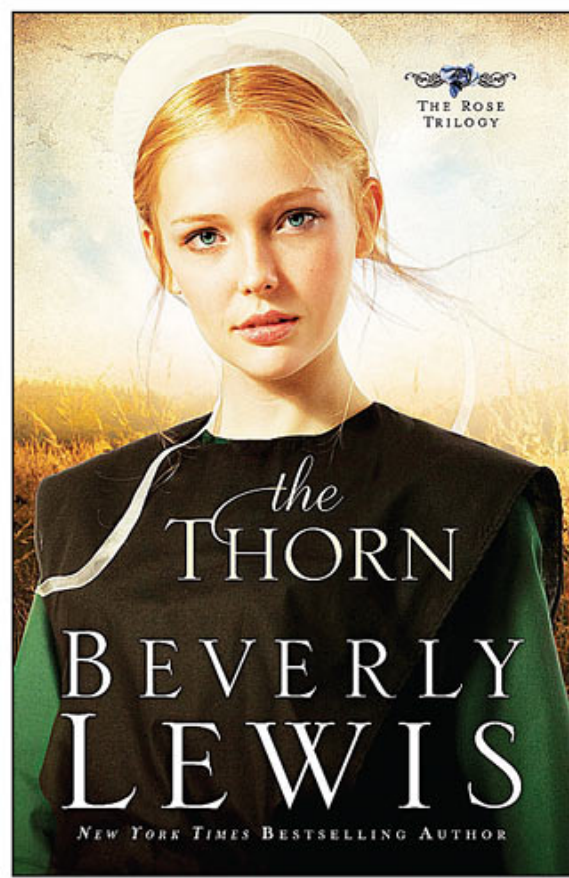

Noble (nf). **"Young Mr. Obama: Chicago and the Making of a Black President,"** by Edward McClelland (nf). **"Sleepwalk With Me and Other Painfully True Stories,"** by Mike Birbiglia (nf): Series of comic, self-deprecating essays about childhood ambitions and adult delusions that led to a life-threatening sleepwalking incident. **"How To Do Everything,"** by Red Green (f): Comic ways to handle anything, like cooking with acetylene, taking revenge on a lawn mower, how to reduce your carbon footprint and make your own alternative fuel. **"Playing the Game,"** by Barbara Taylor Bradford (f): Annette Remington's much older husband, a manipulating and controlling man who has groomed Annette to become an international art star, chooses a young journalist to do a profile of his wife, but Annette, despite

the attraction to the journalist, is worried that her life will come unraveled if he uncovers her secrets.

"Star Guitars: 101 Guitars That Rocked the World," by Dave Hunter (nf): First-ever illustrated history of the guitars of the stars who made the music such as B.B. King's Lucille, Eric Clapton's Blackie, Neil Young's Old Black, and many more. **"The Weekend,"** by Bernhard Schlink (f): Old friends and lovers reunite for a weekend in a secluded country home after spending decades apart to celebrate the release of a convicted murderer and terrorist, one of whom wants him to continue to fight for the



development, the copycats, and the way it has changed war and influenced security and development in large sections of the world.

"THE THORN" (The Rose Trilogy, Book 1), by Beverly Lewis, Bethany House, \$14.99 (f)

Lancaster County may seem idyllic, but it is not without its thorns. Rose Kauffman, a spirited young woman, has a close friendship with the bishop's foster son. Nick dresses plain and works hard

but stirs up plenty of trouble, too. Rose's sister cautions her against becoming too involved, but Rose is being courted by a good, Amish fellow, so dismisses the warnings. Rose's older sister, Hen, knows more than she should about falling for the wrong man. Unable to abandon her Amish ways, Hen is soon separated from her very modern husband. Will Hen be able to re-establish her place among the people she abandoned? And will she be able to convince Rose to steer clear of

rogue neighbor Nick?
