GRANTS AVAILABLE FOR PROGRAMS IN AMERICAN HISTORY

The Utah Humanities Council announces the continuation of an initiative called We The People. Funded by a special appropriation from Congress to the National Endowment for the Humanities, We The People supports programs that explore significant events, people, and themes in American history. The Utah Humanities Council invites grant proposals that focus on advancing the public's knowledge of America's past and the principles that define our nation.

Examples of projects that may fit UHC's criteria for a We The People grant include (but are not limited to):

- An exhibition, public lecture, symposium, or conference that explores any theme, event, or issue associated with American history and culture. Applicants should feel free to explore the full breadth of the American experience. Topics in social, political, and cultural history (immigration, ethnicity, popular entertainment, and race relations, for example) will be considered.
- Development and production of a documentary film on one or more aspects of America's past with a planned public screening.
- A program designed to give public audiences an historical explanation of the work of an American artist, author, or poet.
- A seminar or public lecture series that focuses on the place of Utah in the broader history of the United States.
- Proposals for We The People funding will be evaluated through UHC's established grant review process and must meet already established guidelines posted on UHC's website (www.utahhumanities.org/Grants.php). Funding may be sought through the Major Grant (Applications Deadlines are August 1, 2010; February 1, 2011), Quick Grant (No Deadline), or research fellowship application (Application Deadline is February 1, 2011) process.
- Any nonprofit organization, institution, or group, whether or not incorporated or tax-exempt, is eligible to submit a proposal for a We The People grant. Potential applicants include colleges and universities, libraries, museums, historical societies, professional associations, agencies of state and local government, community organizations, public radio and television stations, and ad hoc groups. Co-sponsorship by two or more organizations is encouraged. Funding through UHC (with the exception of the research fellowship programs) is not available to individuals.
- The Utah Humanities Council staff will be happy to advise you on completing the application process for a We The People grant, as well as to suggest appropriate scholars or other resources that may be useful to you. THREE CANYONEERS INJURED IN ZION NATIONAL PARK

On Saturday, July 24, three men from the Las Vegas area were caught in a flash flood while canyoneering in Spry Canyon in Zion National Park. All three were washed over a 40 foot drop and two of them were also washed over a 60 foot drop. All three were injured and were rescued by park rangers.

On Saturday afternoon a severe thunderstorm developed over Zion National Park dropping about an inch of rain in less than thirty minutes. Several canyons in the southern end of the park were reported to be flash flooding including Spry Canyon. Spry Canyon drains into Pine Creek and is visible from the switchbacks west of the Zion Mt-Carmel Tunnel. One of the injured men used a headlamp to signal a distress call. An off duty Park Ranger travelling on the switchbacks reported seeing the flashing light at the top of the last rappel in Spry Canyon. He reported the flashing light and two rangers were sent to the location and discovered the injured men.

A helicopter was used to short haul the two most seriously injured men to air ambulances that then transported them to the Dixie Regional Medical Center in St. George, Utah. The third man was assisted out by foot and then transported by ground ambulance to Dixie Regional Medical Center. The rescue effort involved 20 park personnel and three helicopters.

The weather report for Saturday, July 24, was for a 30 percent chance of afternoon thunderstorms and the U.S. Weather Service issued a moderate potential for flash flooding. This incident emphasizes the importance heeding the weather and flash flood potential reports and seriously considering the advisability of entering narrow canyons when rain and flash flooding are a possibility.
