4H Mentoring is a program where junior's and senior's from Delta High School volunteer to help kids age 9-14. It's a program that comes down from Utah State University through the County Extension. It is a school based mentoring program, so Delta High has agreed to excuse the volunteer mentors for one class period a week to go to either the middle school or elementary school and help in the class room of the child they have been matched with. The mentors also attend family night out, a night of activities held once a month for the youth and their family. This year we have 44 volunteer mentors. These youth that volunteer

are exceptional people that want to make a difference. That makes 44 hours of extra help a week in our schools. This year we were able to take four of our mentors to TLT (teen leadership training) at Utah State University where they were taught leadership life skills, healthy lifestyle, problem solving, decision making skills and many more things.
