California Zephyr from Utah to San Francisco can see some pretty scenery. The Coast Starlight passes by the ocean and through the Cascade mountains going from San Francisco to Portland, and the Empire Builder crosses more fantastic landscapes from Portland to Chicago, as does the California Zephyr from Chicago back to Salt Lake City.

Together, the routes make up the "Scenic Triangle Tour." If you book the tour going one direction, you can see it all, said Kuhn, of Salt Lake City. If you book it heading the opposite direction, the trains pass the most beautiful sites in the dark of night.

Nature center ready to get wild in June

OGDEN — June will be wild at the Ogden Nature Center.

Wild Wednesday programs start at 3:30 p.m. each week of the month, with presentations on a different nature topic each time.

• June 2 — "Endangered in Utah" focuses on what causes animals and plants to become endangered, and what people can do about it. Des Ta Te, the center's bald eagle, and Laser the desert tortoise will be part of the program.

• June 9 — "Hiding Habitats: Wetlands" includes a walk on the center's trails to look for signs of wildlife in

and around ponds.

• June 16 — "Whoooo Eats Whom?" Gidget the northern saw-whet owl is part of this presentation about predator-prey relationships.

• June 23 — "Summer Solstice Time" explores why some days are longer than others, and how plants and animals adjust.

• June 30 — "Fantastic Falcons" includes time observing falcons, and seeing what makes them unique.

Admission to Wild Wednesdays is \$4 for adults, \$3 for seniors and \$2 for children.

Thanks to Weber County RAMP funds, admission to Ogden Nature Center is free on Saturdays during the summer. Saturday programs include wildlife presentations at 10 a.m. and craft or nature activities at 1 p.m.

LOGAN — The Nooche, or Ute people, are the focus of the next "Saturday at the Museum" activity at Utah State University's Museum of Anthropology.

Visitors are invited to learn about the Nooche from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, with special activities designed for families.

Larry Cesspooch, from the Utah Humanities Council's "Public Square" program, will speak at 1 p.m. in the museum. He'll discuss

periods that greatly affected the Ute people, including the coming of Spanish explorers and settlement by members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.
