Public invited to free training for 'Communities that Care'

In a collaborative effort to address local problem behaviors such as youth substance abuse, violence, and teen pregnancy the Moab Community Action Coalition (www.moabcac.org), Four Corners Community Behavioral Health and Moab city are partnering to implement the Communities that Care Prevention model.

On Sept. 1, the Utah Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health approved a \$7,000 matching grant to help pay for a Communities that Care coordinator, a position carried out by the Moab Teen Center director. The community is invited to participate in community prevention, and the local groups will hold a special all-day training on

Sept. 13. The training, "Environmental Prevention - from the Inside Out," will be conducted by Oregon-based trainer Nigel Wrangham. Continued from page A1 character." Lights remain a requirement for intersections with major collector streets.

The county's major collector streets are 400 East, Mill Creek Drive, Spanish Valley Drive, Murphy Lane, and Spanish Trail Drive, Wright said.

Examples of minor collection streets where lights will not be required are Holyoak Lane, Old City Park Road, and West Highland Drive, he said.

While the developments must pay for the lights, the cost of electricity for them is borne by the road department, according to Grand County Road Department Supervisor Bill Jackson.

Requests from the public made during previous public hearings to allow streets dedicated to the county to be narrower than 34-feet wide were rejected by the council on the grounds that 34 feet is less than the 38 feet required by previous standards, and because, according to Wright, private streets as

narrow as 20 feet are allowed in subdivisions.

Another request that would have changed the requirement for flood control plans on properties with more than 7,000 square feet of impervious area to 5,000 square feet was rejected by the council after Wright explained that 7,000 square feet is only 16 percent of a one-acre lot, and not enough to "greatly affect storm water runoff."

Impervious areas are defined as rooftops, driveways, sidewalks, patios, and other surfaces that water immediately runs off of, Wright said.

Council member Bob Green-

berg said he could not vote for the new standards because the taxpayer must cover the cost of operating a significant number of new streetlights. He asked for evidence that there have been enough accidents in the county to justify the cost.

Greenberg decided to vote for the new standards after council member Ken Ballantyne, a retired Utah Highway Patrol trooper, said additional lighting can help prevent car accidents.

"Having cleaned up the aftermath of collisions at intersections, I say a light is a small price to pay [for safety]," Ballantyne said.

Continued from page A1 service from points in southeastern Utah to the Salt Lake City airport. Big Horn continued to operate for several years after her departure, but discontinued service in July of this year.

In the meantime, Mattox earned a University of Utah degree in speech communications, with an emphasis in organizational behavior.

Among her new duties, Mattox will administer the county's pay-for-performance program. She called it a "good tool for employees and supervisors to work together to set goals."

Mattox said that just sitting down and talking is good for the relationship between an employee and a supervisor. "And it's good for the organization," she said.
